previously worked at CHUK, so we understood each other from the beginning. The meeting went well and we are to write a proposal in order to get their support for a future visit which will be for the District Hospital perioperative staff.

We enjoyed supper with our two Rwandan Clinical Ambassadors on Thursday evening at the hotel and despite a very noisy table due to the TV and a full restaurant, it was a very pleasant evening catching up with them and renewing links and friendships.

The Director of Nursing, the Matron and Theatre Manager were all able to be present for the closing ceremony and certificate presentations which was excellent, given how busy they all are. We are most grateful for their organisation to ensure our week went smoothly.
